## XI. Capacity-building under the Kyoto Protocol

(Agenda item 11)

- 102. The SBI welcomed the report by the secretariat on activities being implemented to support capacity-building in developing countries (FCCC/SBI/2006/16).
- 103. The SBI noted the efforts in capacity-building by Parties and various organizations in response to decision 29/CMP.1, and expressed strong support for the inclusion of information and outcomes of those activities in monitoring of the capacity-building framework for developing countries contained in the annex to decision 2/CP.7.
- 104. The SBI welcomed the value of sharing best practices and lessons of the first informal designated national authorities forum of the clean development mechanism (CDM) which was convened in Bonn, Germany, in October 2006.
- 105. The SBI noted the relevant sections of the report of the Executive Board of the CDM related to regional distribution of CDM project activities and related capacity-building.
- 106. The SBI welcomed the meeting held in Nairobi, Kenya, and organized by United Nations agencies<sup>34</sup> and other key organizations<sup>35</sup> to develop a coherent approach to capacity-building for CDM activities for the African region, but recognized the need to also address the special needs of least developed countries and SIDS.
- 107. The SBI decided to recommend a draft decision<sup>36</sup> on this matter for adoption by the COP/MOP at its second session (for the text of the decision, see FCCC/SBI/2006/L.34/Add.1).
